"It is a real honour to step into this role; the co-chair of RPI. For those I have not connected with yet, I'll share a little bit about my RP Journey. I am a secondary school teacher and first trained in RP in 2017. I was trained by the RP Team in our school and a world of comfort and possibility opened before me. RP allowed me to be myself and more significantly live the values I had come to know personally and professionally. I pursued further training and in 2022, CDI made me an RP Champion. I have trained many teachers, students, school leaders and parents.

I would describe my journey as a winding stair. I learn more with each step as my awareness rises yet I continuously return to the values that I know to be true. From 2022, I started working with AVP Ireland in the Midlands Prison, and gained a deeper understanding of how to build community in the most challenging of environments. Every circle confronts me with our shared experience as humans. What sustains me is the community of RP practitioners of our school, Newbridge College. The RP team is

creative, resilient and supportive. In the last two years, we have developed a network with local schools. We come together to connect, learn and share from each other. The Newbridge RP Team is a space I treasure as it is the space that has nurtured me into and teacher and RP leader I am today.

My introduction to RPI was meeting the formidable Kieran O' Dwyer. We met and discussed Education, but a powerful insight emerged for me in that meeting. The perspectives Restorative Practitioners bring and those from the Restorative Justice space. I started working with the RPI Events and Communications Committee in 2022. Richie Walsh led us to create a National Conference in Newbridge College in 2023. It was a real honour to organise our national conference in our Newbridge RP home. I have learned so much from these energetic and skilled practitioners on the committee. It was a fantastic journey to begin with and the relationships formed encourages me to continue working with RPI. I have been working behind the scenes on X (formally Twitter) and hope



to grow our website and social media presence to communicate the powerful restorative work we do.
